Grace, mercy, and peace are yours in our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ!

Dear Family of God at Grace,

A blessed July to all of you! We will be spending Independence Day at Andrew and Nicole's home, our son and daughter-in-law. On the 4th it is always great to spend the day with family, food, and fireworks. It is sure to be a blessed day.

Do you remember the best fireworks display you have ever seen? I have a couple that come to mind. When I was a teen, we were visiting with my Uncle Tom and his family in Cincinnati Ohio. The city was having a celebration/dedication of a new bridge. They had a display of fireworks that was incredible.

I can't speak for my family, but two memorable 4th of July celebrations were the two we had in Washington DC. Being in our nation's capital on Independence Day is an awesome experience. The fireworks were second to none. Sitting at the base of the Washington Monument on the Mall with 3 million of my closest friends and eating food and drinks out of the cooler we brought, watching the display over the reflection pool of the Lincon Memorial was unforgettable.



On our first 4th of July here in Naples, we went to the beach to watch the fireworks and my kids said after the display, "That was it? Is it over?" Now it was a nice display but after coming from DC, everything else is just not as good.

This 4th of July there are no fireworks in Naples due to the pier being damaged by Ian and because we are having the 100th birthday of our city, the council has decided to hold off and do a display of fireworks for the Centennial Celebration.

America, as a nation, has been fascinated with fireworks from the beginning. Even before our first Independence Day Celebration we lit off firework displays for different events. I guess we like bright sparkling flashes and loud booms in the sky. These are displays of glory and power. They are great celebrations of wonderful events that should be remembered!

You may be wondering, "why all this firework talk?" Well, when I see the fireworks, I think about Jesus' return. What does Jesus Second Advent look like? Let me share a page from the Commission on Theology and Church Relations of our Lutheran Church Missouri Synod written in 1989. It is called, *The End Times: A Study on Eschatology and Millennialism*.

The Second Advent of Christ

The New Testament Scriptures teach that Christ will one day visibly return in glory. They refer to His second advent by using several different terms: "coming" or "presence" (parousia), "appearance" (epiphaneia; s.v. phaneroo), "revelation" (apokalypsis), and "the day of the Lord" (hi hemera tou Kyriou). A study of the texts in which these terms occur reveals that Christ's second advent is one event at the end of history. The Scriptures teach the following concerning Christ's second and final coming:

- 1. Christ will come visibly and all people will see Him (Acts 1:11; Matt. 24:27,30; Luke 17:22-24; 21:27,35; Mark 13:24-26; 14:62; Rev. 1:7).
- 2. Christ will come in glory surrounded by the host of His angels (Matt. 13:39-43,49; 16:27; 24:30-31; 25:31; 2 Thess. 1:7; Rev. 19:11-14; Titus 2:13; Jude 14, 24; 1 Pet. 4:13; Zech. 14:3).
- 3. When Christ returns, a bodily resurrection of all the dead will take place. Believers will be raised to salvation and unbelievers to damnation John 5:27-29; 6:39-40,44,54; Rev. 20:11-15; 1 Cor. 15:12-57; Dan. 12:1-2). All believers, both dead and living, will be "caught up" to "meet the Lord in the air" (1 Thess. 4:13-17). Death will be destroyed (1 Cor. 15:26,54-57; Rev. 20:14).
- 4. When Christ returns, He will judge all people, both the living and the dead (Matt. 25:31-46; John 5:27; Acts 10:42; 17:31; Rom. 2:16; 2 Tim. 4:1,8; Jude 14-15; Rev. 20:11-15). Believers will receive eternal salvation and unbelievers eternal damnation (Matt. 25:31-46; 1 Pet. 1:4-5,7; 5:4; 1 John 3:2; Heb. 9:28; 2 Cor. 5:10; 2 Thess. 1:6-10). Satan and the Antichrist will be destroyed (2 Thess. 2:8; Rev. 20:10).

5. When Christ returns, "new heavens and a new earth" will be created (2 Pet. 3:10-13). Nowhere, however, do the Scriptures teach that at His return Christ will establish a this-worldly, political kingdom or "millennium."

The date of Christ's second advent is unknown. Jesus Himself taught, "But of that day and hour no one knows, not even the angels of heaven, nor the Son, but the Father only" (Matt. 24:36; Matt. 24:42,44; 25:13; 1 Thessalonians 5; 2 Peter 3). The times or seasons fixed by the authority of the Father are "not for you to know" (Acts 1:7). Therefore, speculation concerning the time of the end is forbidden.

This much can be said: the fact that God has delayed it now for almost two millennia is due to His patience and mercy, for "the Lord is not slow about His promise as some count slowness, but is forbearing toward you, not wishing that any should perish, but that all should reach repentance" (2 Pet. 3:9). The Scriptural teaching concerning Christ's second advent has a very practical purpose. God wills that all come to believe in the Gospel, lead a holy life in service to Christ, and eagerly await the last day with patience (Rom. 13:12-14; Titus 2:11-13; 1 Pet. 1:13-15; 2 Pet. 3:11-12; 1 John 3:2-3; 1 Tim. 6:14; Matt. 25:14-30).

The Lord Jesus' Return/Second Advent is certainly a reason for celebration and remembrance! I can't imagine the fireworks display that Jesus will bring with him. I hope you join with me in hopeful expectation for that great return of our Lord Jesus! Until that day we will have to settle for the firework displays we have on the 4th.





There is a sign-up sheet on the bulletin board in the Narthex for you to claim the date for your special occasion. Cost of arrangements is \$45.00.



Annapolis. He earned a bachelor's degree from Lehigh University in Bethlehem, Pa., in 2012 and a Master of Divinity degree from Concordia Theological Seminary, Fort Wayne, in 2021. After

college, he served the LCMS as a GEO missionary and communications specialist for the Africa region (2013–2016). He then was director of communications at St. John Lutheran Church and School in Indianapolis (2016–2017) before enrolling in the seminary. In his free time, Philip enjoys reading, writing, hiking, biking and cooking.

Rachel was born in Bryant, Ind. She received a Bachelor of Arts in Theology degree with deaconess certification from Concordia University Chicago, River Forest, Ill., in 2013. Like Philip, she also previously served as a missionary — first as a deaconess intern in Peru (2012–2014) and then as a career missionary to the Dominican Republic (2014–2017). Prior to moving to Uruguay, Rachel was the founding executive director of The Shepherd's Hand Community Outreach Center, a new LCMS Recognized Service Organization in Fort Wayne, Ind. In her free time, she enjoys cooking, baking, reading, hiking and exercising.

KFUO (850 kHz) is a non-commercial AM radio station licensed to Clayton, Missouri and serving Greater St. Louis. It has a Christian talk and teaching radio format. KFUO is one of the oldest continuous operating Christian radio stations in the United States, with its first broadcast on October 26, 1924; 98 years ago. Owned and operated by The Lutheran Church–Missouri Synod (LCMS), its radio studios and offices are in the LCMS headquarters in Kirkwood, Missouri.

KFUO is a <u>daytimer</u> station. By day, it is powered at 5,000 <u>watts</u>, using a <u>non-directional antenna</u>. Because KFUO operates on the same frequency as <u>Class A KOA (AM) Denver</u>, KFUO must <u>sign off</u> at sunset. As such, the on-air hours vary depending on time of year. The station's website plays sacred music when the 850 signal is <u>dark</u>. KFUO broadcasts using <u>HD Radio</u> technology. The <u>transmitter</u> is on the grounds of the <u>Concordia Seminary</u> in Clayton.

Bernie and Helen created their first estate plan when they were 25, right after the birth of their first child. In the fifty years since that time, they have had three more children, and now have eight grandchildren. During those fifty years, they moved four times, to four different states. In each place, they engaged with their local church. Combined, there have been six congregations in their lives. Two of them have closed, as they were located in urban areas that changed from the ethnic origins of the congregations.

Two of the congregations have Lutheran Schools, bursting at the seams with enrollment. One of the congregations has a vibrant caring ministry for battered women. One has an outreach to immigrants in their community. All four of these congregations and their ministries have had a

place in Bernie's and Helen's life. They want to reflect this connection with ministry and update their fifty-year-old wills, creating gifts for their children and grandchildren.

They met with their local LCMS Foundation Gift Planning Counselor and began organizing a survey of family, assets, and goals. They indicated that one of their goals is to build flexibility into their plans, as life has taught them that life changes. They were happy to see some of the flexible tools the LCMS Foundation offers. Now instead of putting off their planning, or dreading it, they are excited about leaning into the future which includes one day living face to face with Jesus.
