### October 2023 Newsletter



Dear Family of God at Grace, Grace, mercy and peace are yours in our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ!

October is Reformation month. We celebrate that restoration of the Gospel in its truth and purity.

#### We celebrate:

- That Jesus Christ, the second person of the Trinity, was born in the flesh.
- That He lived the life without sin that we cannot.
- That He took our sin into His flesh and died our death upon the cross.
- That on the third day He rose again and then ascended into heaven where He stands for us as our own high priest before the Father.
- That by God's grace, through faith in Jesus, we have all that Jesus won for us, freely, without any merit or worthiness in ourselves.

**This pure Gospel is free!** Forgiveness before God is free in Christ Jesus! We earn nothing, Jesus, earned it all and in Him all is now ours! There is no buying forgiveness. There is no "buy your way out of purgatory", for two reasons.

- First: Forgiveness is not something we pay for: it's something Jesus paid for and then freely gives to us.
- Second, because there is no purgatory, just heaven and hell, there is no buying our way into heaven. Because Jesus paid the price for us in full, no late fees or tips are required. There is no extra amount that Jesus forgot to pay. There is no more to cover. We do not believe that Jesus did His part and now we must

do ours. The only thing left for us is to believe in Jesus and even in that God does the work!

# The door is open for you to enter the mansion prepared for you by your Savior alone, so walk on in!

Psalm 118:17 "I shall not die, but I shall live" (our theme verse for this year) is true because of Christ Jesus and His sweet Gospel! Having that Gospel restored, what do we do with it? Often, when Jesus healed someone, He would tell them *not* to tell anyone about what He had done for them because His hour had not yet come. After telling those involved in the miracle not to tell people, what did they do? They ran out and told everyone! They couldn't keep their yappers shut!

Jesus has performed a miracle with you. In the waters of your Baptism, He covered you with all His saving gifts: forgiveness, life, and salvation are all yours in your Baptism. Jesus raised you from the dead and gave you His life. He washed you clean and gave you His robe of righteousness. The flood gates have opened wide the gates of heaven—all for you! What is our response? Often it is, "Let's not tell a soul." Jesus never said to you, "Don't tell anyone." Jesus' hour has already come. Now there is no reason to keep that good news a secret. Now is the time to tell the world, or at least tell someone, *anyone*!

Now you may say, "Pastor, I don't know what to say to people. I'm no evangelist. Isn't that your job?" Well, yes, it is my job to tell people about Jesus, but I'm only one person. I can help you so that you can feel comfortable talking about Jesus to others. If we have a whole congregation of people telling others about Jesus, we can certainly reach more people in our community than if it's only me. (see Ephesians 4:11-12)

Now I know that many of you already tell people about Jesus and share your faith. Thanks be to God for that. What I'd like to do is help more of you feel more confident in sharing your faith. To make this possible I'd like to start a new class that will help equip you to be a witness.

Our Synod has developed a program called "Everyone His Witness." We scratched the surface of this program last year in the Sunday Bible Class. It uses something called the LASSIE method. That's an acrostic for Listen, Ask, Seek, Share, Invite, Encourage. It's a simple model to help you witness about Jesus to people you meet in everyday life. The goal here is not to make new members of Grace Lutheran, although we hope that happens; the goal is to share the true and pure Gospel of Jesus with those who may have never heard it before so that they can know Jesus and have the gifts that only He gives. We want as many people as possible to know Jesus the way we know Jesus!



Our Church Council and Evangelism Committee want to challenge and encourage all of you to be more proactive in sharing Jesus with our community. This is a start in that

direction. I want to help put the tools in your tool bag to tell people about Jesus. Our calling is to have conversations; it's the Spirit's job to use the Gospel shared in those conversations to convert and change hearts and souls. I'd like to start these classes on the first Saturday of October, which is the 7<sup>th</sup>, from 8-10AM. Classes will continue on the first Saturday of every month at 8AM. Join in whenever you are able. Come and learn some tools in sharing the good news of Jesus with your neighbor! These classes are for everyone at Grace. All ages are welcome! We pray that we will see you on Saturday, October 7<sup>th</sup>.

What else is going on at Grace this month?





### **Endowment Grants 2023**

It's that time of year again for the Endowment Committee to solicit from the congregation members grant proposals for funds to be distributed from the general endowment fund.

Depending on the returns in the next few months, around \$40,000 should be available for grants. The past couple of years a number of missions, church projects and scholarships have been supported through use of these funds, and we look forward to having some excellent proposals again this year. **Grant application forms are available in the church office and need to be returned to the endowment committee box in the church office by October 15, 2023.** 

The criteria the committee will use in evaluating the proposal follows:

- Grant proposal must be submitted by a member of Grace Lutheran Church.
- Grant should not cover yearly congregation budget items.
- Grant should fit with congregation vision and mission statements; with primary emphasis on the spreading of the Gospel.
- Priority will be given to the (1) congregation (2) circuit (3) district and (4) synod, in that order.
- Scholarships should go to students going into full-time church work.

## Missionary of the Month - Rev. Dr. David & Jennifer Preus

The Rev. Dr. David and Jennifer Preus serve the Lord through The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod (LCMS) in Eurasia, based in Romania. In this role, David serves as a professor with the Livonian Lutheran Project, where he provides theological education to future pastors of the Eurasia region. He also serves as an assistant pastor, recruiter and mentor to new and upcoming pastors in the lower Balkan and Mediterranean subregion. In this capacity, David helps to establish a network of communication and strengthen the brotherhood among pastors of the region,

including in Brasov and Bucharest, Romania; Sofia, Bulgari; Salonica (Thessaloniki), Greece; Padua and Rome, Italy; Spain; and Portugal.

David was born in Fort Wayne, Ind. He earned a bachelor's degree from Bethany Lutheran College, Mankato, Minn. He received his Master of Divinity from Concordia Theological Seminary, Fort Wayne, and his Doctor of Philosophy (Ph.D.) degree from Concordia Seminary, St. Louis. Before taking a call to the mission field, David served as a pastor at Mount Olive Lutheran Church, Billings, Mont. (2011–2015).

Jennifer was born in Lake Forest, III. She earned a bachelor's degree from Bethany Lutheran College, Mankato, Minn., and a master's degree from Minnesota State University, Mankato. David and Jennifer have eight beautiful children — Hans, Rebekah, Rolf, Lena, Søren, Leif, Andreas and Lars — who are with them on the mission field.
