Dear Family of God at Grace,

September is here and with it, a new season begins. That means we will be spinning up our seasonal activities. Let's start with Sundays and work our way through the week.

Sunday School starts up for the youth on Sunday, September 10th, with a kickoff for the new year.

The adult class on Sunday mornings has been studying the Augsburg Confession. We are bringing that to a close and will begin examining the Hymn of the Day for each Sunday. We sing these great hymns of the faith and often never spend much time on the who, what, and why of the hymn. I think this study will help you appreciate and draw strength from the Hymn of the Day for each Sunday.

Confirmation will start on Wednesday, the 6th, at 4:30 pm. We will also have a "First Communion" class for our new confirmands. They need strength and forgiveness in their battle with sin, the flesh, and the devil and what better strength and forgiveness than the Lord's Supper! Please pray regularly for our confirmands. They need your prayers and encouragement.

The choirs will be start rehearsing again on Wednesday the 6th. It will be wonderful to have them back to enhance worship. They add so much to the Divine Service. Thank you to all who sing and play instruments! You are true blessings to the people of God at Grace!

What is **NOT** coming back in September are dinners, Wednesday evening worship, and the Men of Grace Bible class. These activities will all start in October.

We have had some terrible events happen during the last month: the hurricane in California, the fires in

Hawaii, and tornados in Indiana and Missouri and Michigan. You are probably asking, "What can we do? How can we help?" The best way to help is to go to LCMS.org and then to "Disaster Response." There you will find multiple ways that you can help. Thank you for your willingness and your generosity!

As we begin a new season, I want to share the Bible verse that will be our theme verse for the season. It comes from Psalm 118. There are several great verses in this Psalm and I encourage you to read the whole Psalm. Portions of this Psalm are used in the Committal (Funeral) Service. When I read it, I use verse 17 as an antiphon to ring through the ears and hearts of those grieving, "I shall not die, but I shall live." In Christ we live, even though we die!

Verse 14, "The Lord is my strength and my song, he has become my salvation." Verse 19, "Open to me the gates of righteousness, that I may enter through them and give thanks to the Lord." This Psalm is about celebration in what the Lord is doing for His people! It was written for the celebration of King David and the dedication of the second temple. Martin Luther said it was his favorite Psalm.

Of all these wonderful choices of verses in Psalm 118, I'd like for us to focus on verse 8, "It is better to take refuge in the Lord than to trust in man." So many things this year will turn our trust to man, but that is not where our trust should be! It is better to take refuge in the Lord! My prayer is that this verse will be a blessing to you this season as you take refuge in the Lord rather than trusting in man.



Endowment Grants 2023

It's that time of year again for the Endowment Committee to solicit from the congregation members grant proposals for funds to be distributed from the general endowment fund.

Depending on the returns in the next few months, around \$40,000 should be available for grants. The past couple of years a number of missions, church projects and scholarships have been supported through use of these funds, and we look forward to having some excellent proposals again this year. Grant application forms are available in the church office and should be returned to the endowment committee box in the church office by October 15, 2023.

The criteria the committee will use in evaluating the proposal follows:

- Grant proposal must be submitted by a member of Grace Lutheran Church.
- Grant should not cover yearly congregation budget items.
- Grant should fit with congregation vision and mission statements; with primary emphasis on the spreading of the Gospel.
- Priority will be given to the (1) congregation (2) circuit (3) district and (4) synod, in that order.
- Scholarships should go to students going into full-time church work.



Missionary of the Month

Dear Sisters and Brothers of God's Family at Grace,

We are blessed to have as our Missionary of the month, Jay and Julie Dass. You probably remember them from Julie's wonderful work with the Voice of Faith, a Christian outreach to Muslim and Sikh communities here in Florida.



Out of this mission, change came to take them in a new direction. Jay went to seminary and became Pastor Dass. He was ordained into the Holy Ministry of the Lutheran Church--Missouri Synod. God be praised!

Now after 40+ years of being American citizens and living here in Naples and attending Faith Lutheran Church, Rev. Jay Dass and his faithful Spirit-filled wife Julie, have moved back to their home country and are taking up God's mighty work of starting The Lutheran Confessional Church Pakistan.

This is not a *walk* of faith, but a *giant leap* of faith, and we see God's hand at every turn, opening the doors to make this dream a reality. They already have a group of young men who are studying and training for the office of Lutheran Pastor. They have baptized many people and have instructed many who now receive the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper! People are hungry for the Good News of Jesus.

The mission statement of the LCCP is: Empowered by the Holy Spirit through Word and Sacraments and in grateful response to God's grace, the mission of the Lutheran Confessional Church Pakistan is to vigorously make known the love of Christ by word and deed within our churches and communities in Pakistan.

Their Mission Priorities are to evangelize and disciple the lost; plant and sustain Lutheran churches; support and expand multilingual theological education; provide human care in proximity to Word and Sacrament ministries; strengthen and support the Lutheran family in living out God's design; nurture the spiritual, emotional, and physical wellbeing of pastors and professional church workers; and to collaborate with LCMS/Eurasia to maximize mission effectiveness.

Pastor Jay Dass and Julie are 3rd generation Christians. They emigrated from Pakistan to the United States in the 1980's, have two adult sons, and joined the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod in 2010. In 2016, Jay began his Lutheran education through Concordia Seminary in St. Louis and has served as Vicar at Living Faith Lutheran Church in Cumming, GA, under the supervision of Rev. Timothy J. Droegemueller. Julie, whose heart for sharing Jesus is contagious, is Jay's partner in ministry and is currently studying to become a deaconess in the LCMS. Jay and Julie are now serving in Pakistan under the leadership and supervision of Rev Jim Krikava, the Eurasia Mission Director and in partnership with several LCMS churches. Having been raised in Pakistan, Pastor Dass knows the language and culture. He is being led by the Holy Spirit to take true Lutheran theology into Pakistan, plant a church and share the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ with non-believers.

In January 2020, their third visit to Pakistan, Pastor Jay and Julie were given the duties to assist nine students in preparation for their move to Riga, Latvia. Then... a pandemic hit and the world shut down. Flights were grounded. Seminary was closed. All plans were on hold. Many are the plans in the mind of a man, but it is the purpose of the LORD that will stand. Proverbs 19:21 Jay and Julie spent the next 10 months relying on God 's provisions and the Holy Spirit 's guidance. During this time God 's relief work was done among the poor and outcast Christians in Muslim dominated Pakistan. More than 25 families heard the Word of God and hungrily received Lutheran teaching.

The ministry began to spread like a Holy fire. This is the work of the Holy Spirit! Amazingly since then, 12 pastors from existing Christian churches in Pakistan have agreed to enter the seminary pastoral colloquy program and to have their congregations Catechized. Thanks be to God!

KFUO (850 kHz) is a non-commercial AM radio station licensed to Clayton, Missouri and serving Greater St. Louis. It has a Christian talk and teaching radio format. KFUO is one of the oldest continuous operating Christian radio stations in the United States, with its first broadcast on October 26, 1924; 98 years ago. Owned and operated by The Lutheran Church–Missouri Synod (LCMS), its radio studios and offices are in the LCMS headquarters in Kirkwood, Missouri.

KFUO is a daytimer station. By day, it is powered at 5,000 watts, using a non-directional antenna. Because KFUO operates on the same frequency as Class A KOA (AM) Denver, KFUO must sign off at sunset. As such, the on-air hours vary depending on time of year. The station's website plays sacred music when the 850 signal is dark. KFUO broadcasts using HD Radio technology. The transmitter is on the grounds of the Concordia Seminary in Clayton.
